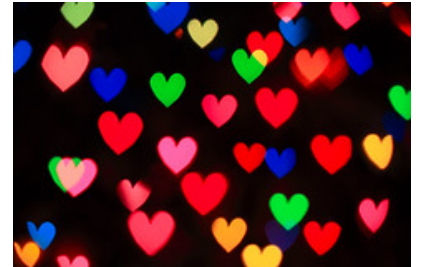
Somebody Loves You, Mr. Hatch by Eileen Spinelli, Author; Paul Yalowitz, Illustrator.

Family Activity – Three Valentine’s a Day Ritual¹
